Conservation Agriculture gets Underway

A Story of Transformation from AICT Geita







Farmers took a field visit during the AICT Geita CA Training.

It is clear that farmers are looking for new, inexpensive ways to improve their crop yields and soil fertility. They have made it clear to us throughout the introduction of conservation agriculture (CA) in the communities, the initial trainings, and the response from the communi-

Demonstration Plots

Both partners, AICT MUD and AICT Geita, have successfully implemented their initial CA trainings. They invited champion farmers from each community as well as the Government Extension Officers. During the trainings, both partners were able to provide hands on training by starting the first demonstration plots. Farmers, who are wary of false advertising, empty promises, and poor yields, are slow to adopt new techniques without first seeing proof. Therefore, the partners have initiated demonstration plots in each community to be used as the Farmer Field School. With successful demo plots, we believe adoption will be easier for farmers.

This farmer is seeing the first fruits from the AICT Musoma Demonstration Plot.



Field Classrooms

In most communities, partners are invited to provide the community trainings at one of the farmers' homes. Trainings are usually conducted

in churches, under trees, or outside homes. Rudimentary as it is, this allows the partner to meet the farmers where they are, and begins the relationship building process.



Hands on Learning

Partners work closely with farmers, providing hands on training through every session. Here, a field officer from Geita explains the importance

of proper spacing and the correct amount of manure to be added to each planting basin. This demo plot will provide a good example of the benefits of conservation agriculture.

Government Relationships

Partners work closely with the Government Agricultural Extension Officers as they live and work closely with the community farmers. Extension Officers can often times determine how successful a project like CA will be, due to their support or lack thereof.



Adoption

Adoption comes slowly. In the Ng'mwakiwasha community in Geita, one farmer has been practicing CA for over 3 years under the tutelage of a local missionary. Only now, after seeing his success, have three of his neighbors decided to try CA on their own land. Here, a neighbor shows the CA training class the results of his first year of using Green Manure Cover Crops (GMCC's).
