Healing in His Wings A Story of Transformation

"For you who fear my name, the Sun of Righteousness will rise with healing in his wings. And you will go free, leaping with joy like calves let out to pasture." —Malachi 4:2 (NLT)

Christians rejoice and celebrate Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. He rises with

healing in his wings. He brings light to a dark world. He reaches out to those traumatized and marginalized in a distempered world. Matthew Henry's commentary on Malachi 4:1-3 says, "The saints' triumphs are all owing to God's victories; it is not they that do this, but God who does it for them." God's imagebearers are strategically placed in different places with varying degrees of comfort and pain. The differences in climate, language, and topography from one part of the

world to the other show God's greatness and sovereignty. Communities around the world have varying levels of living and coping with challenges. World Renew continues to work diligently in communities to identify strengths and mobilize resources locally and globally to support communities in pursuit of wholeness and justice.

A recent tour of troubled areas in northern Nigeria shows evidence of massive destruction in several communities in need of restoration and healing. People are living with severe trauma, and the environment is evidently stressed at different levels. Events such as the March 7, 2010 massacre in Dyemburuk, Plateau State, after which 384 people were buried in one grave, are mindboggling.

Through the efforts of African Widow and Orphan Support, some of the many orphans in northern Nigeria are able to go back to school. Some widows are experiencing trauma healing and are engaged in small businesses and looking to God for their future.

The ongoing Boko Haram insurgence in northern Nigeria has killed many people and de-

stroyed private and public property and farms, leaving thousands traumatized and internally displaced. In many places, religious worship buildings have been completely destroyed, and residential homes have been ruined and abandoned. In some communities people are still living in fear of repeated attacks. Many homes are overcrowded because of the influx of internally displaced persons seeking refuge and safety. The situation in many places is heartbreaking.
