## Dear Friends,

LIVING JUSTICE - LOVING MERCY - SERVING CHRIST

As the end of the year approaches, I find myself looking back. World Renew Senegal's partners have accomplished so much in their communities in St. Louis, Dakar, Linguere, and the Fatick area. This year we have trained and supported peer-educators of 34 adolescent health groups; 765 young people participated in these groups, and about 65 girls who had earlier participated in these davidandjessica groups finished their vocational education.

> The vocational education program started four years ago. The adolescent health program had always had a session on "realizing your dreams." That session, in which participants are encouraged to think about their dreams, is very popular because these girls are usually never asked to think about the future or what they might like to do. They have not been to school, and their path is usually already determined. It is rare for people to ask them what they would like to do when they grow up, not just when it comes to possible jobs or choice of spouse but even also with regard to a possible hobby or other interest. In the vocational education program, however, the girls were enrolled in programs of their choice and supported by the program.

Before the summer, SLDS organized an event to celebrate and showcase the achievements of the youth who had followed a course. Parents, community members, and SLDS and World Renew staff were invited to see the clothes and hairstyles the girls had created. We also were served cake made by the catering students, and we watched the first-aid/nursing students demonstrate their skills. The youth and their hoped-for futures were the center of attention, and the students did a great job showing what they had learned. It was a wonderful and hopeful day.
