## Producing with Conservation Agriculture

A Story of Transformation

Nery Antunez is a farmer from the community of Cañada Galana. Nery grows corn, red beans, and other vegetables. He is very passionate about farming and is currently part of a farmers' group in his community, as well as a member of a village savings and loan association. Nery is very happy with, and grateful to God for, the great support of the sustainable livelihoods program provided by World Renew and our Honduran partner, Diaconia Nacional.

Through the sustainable livelihoods program, Nery trained in conservation agriculture and then put it into practice in his plot. By implementing practices like careful cleaning and fencing of the plot, the use of zai holes (a water catchment technique), and production of organic fertilizer, Nery has seen a dramatic increase in his plot's production.

"I was able to harvest 16 quintals of corn that are equivalent to 200 pounds," he says enthusiastically. "Before, I was only able to produce 10 quintals of corn. I am very happy with this result and I am motivating other farmers to practice conser-

vation agriculture. "



Nery is excited about all the possibilities conservation agriculture training has opened up for him: his family has more food to eat; he thinks they may even have enough to be able to feed farm animals such as chickens and pigs; and, because he was trained to produce his own seed, he hopes to obtain an even better crop next year.

We in the Honduran office thank her for her amazing support of World Renew in Honduras — her experience, her teaching, and her help in improving the lives of many of Honduras' neediest families. Her interactions with members of the community are an example to follow, as she always made them feel that they were her equals, that they had a voice, and, most importantly, that they could accomplish anything since God was always by their side.

We want to share with you that this year, thanks to God, we have seen positive changes in all the programs of our partner agencies. We are encouraged and grateful to God and all of you for your help in meeting these goals. God provided us with health, protection, and a personal commitment that makes a difference in the lives the families and communities we serve. You have provided us with support through prayers and donations to help many Honduran families achieve their dreams.



During Christmas we celebrate the greatest gift that God gave to each one of us, the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. This celebration becomes real when we work alongside each other, as it was intended according to Nehemiah 3, to support the neediest among us, walking with them where they are. This is the meaning of Christmas that we want to share with you, and ask you to keep it in your hearts in the year 2018.





This year we welcomed nine teams filled with the love of our Lord Jesus Christ to serve and share with their Honduran family. These eighty-eight Christians played games, read the Bible, cooked together, lived together, and worshipped together as one big family in Christ. They also worked together to build over 50 cement floors, 70 water storage tanks (pilas), 20 latrines, 3 Sunday school classrooms, 1 water project, 1 well, and 1 classroom. Over 200 families now have improved health and infrastructure. The construction of the cement floors, latrines, and water storage tanks met the need for better health conditions as identified by community members. The cement floors will improve the hygiene and health of children in particular, as many children crawl, play, eat, and sleep on floors which, when made of dirt, harbor insects and parasites that lead to diarrhea and respiratory infections. Storing water in tanks will contribute to the hygiene

of the whole family, since families will have immediate access to water used for cleaning and cooking. The construction of latrines helps reduce contamination in the environment and the water tanks allow the supply of water to meet the demands of residents and provide better, less contaminated water.



Finally, five youth graduated from 9th grade this year in the first ever computerassisted learning center in Olancho. Their dreams of continuing their studies and learning how to use computers are now a reality.

This has been such a blessed year. God is good!
