She and her husband live in Nebbi district, Northern Uganda, where high temperatures, sandy soils, and soil infertility have made successful harvests difficult. On top of this, her husband's health is poor and he is unable to work.

## Grace was losing hope for the future.

Then Grace joined a food security project through World Renew and Canadian Foodgrains Bank, and her hope grew. This project, carried out in partnership with a local church, has been a beacon of God's transforming love for this community. Farmers are learning to grow crops, even when there isn't enough rain. Men and women are learning to work together to provide for their families. Parents are saving enough money to send children to school, and marriages are being restored.

Through this project, Grace has learned about the value of saving money, and she is no longer afraid to work with others. She is applying new farming methods, and her harvests are dramatically improving.

"Even though my husband cannot work right now, I was able to integrate cassava and maize together. I could never have done this with the conventional farming method," she said.

Today, Grace and her husband have three plots of land and five goats. They have even saved enough money to add cement to their home. This is a testimony to the transformation that only God can bring.
