What could be less impressive than a worm? With no arms or legs and a brain the size of a pinhead, worms live underground and seem like nothing more than bait for fishing.

But like everything else God has made, a worm has a particular purpose and is VERY good at its job. A worm munches its way through leaves, grass, weeds, and rotten food to produce rich, aerated soil, the nutrient-filled compost (from a process technically called "vermiculture") that city-slickers pay good money for by the bag. Worms are the ultimate recyclers, turning trash into treasure one munch at a time.

In Honduras, World Renew is helping farmers learn to love the lowly worm. For the 60 percent of Hondurans who live in poverty, growing food is not a hobby. It's a necessity.
