

AS A CHILD, Kham Ann searched for bamboo shoots for his family's meals in the forest near his home in northern Laos. Today, he takes his daughters Pai, 9, and Pae, 6. into the same forest in search of bamboo shoots. As they walk. Kham Ann shares with them all that he has learned about proper nutrition through World Renew. Thanks to Free A Family® gifts like yours, Kham Ann's children eat healthier meals than Kham Ann did as a child and many of the vegetables they enjoy come from the kitchen garden that World Renew field staff encouraged Kham Ann to start.

The conversation moves to Kham Ann's mother, Kheo, who has recently returned home after spending several weeks at a drug rehabilitation center. She has gained weight and looks well. Pae asks if it is because Kheo now eats more vegetables. Kham Ann explains that Kheo is also staying away from things that aren't good for her. But he does not mention that Kheo took opium for pain and became addicted.

Kham Ann is proud that Pae and Pai have been doing well at school. His greatest hope is for Pae, Pai and their two younger siblings to complete high school. He is grateful for the training he received in pig rearing, effective agriculture practices, and beekeeping, through Free A Family, that has made it possible for him to increase his income and set aside savings for his children's education. Thank you for your generosity that helps families like Kham Ann's to look to the future with hope.



In September 2020, with gratitude to God for opening doors for her through the Free A Family® program, Merlyn began sharing her story with Free A Family supporters. She has shared how training in small business management helped her grow her tortilla business and how the opportunity to work in a community garden helped her earn extra income and made it possible for her to prepare more vegetable-rich meals for her children.

Alongside the blessings, Merlyn has also shared her struggles. She has discussed how the skyrocketing prices and lockdowns that came with the COVID-19 pandemic slowed the sale of her tortillas. And she has asked for our prayers for her son, Erlin, who has been finding school challenging. When Merlyn agreed to share her story—the blessings and the struggles—she planned to do so until September 2023, but has now found it necessary to stop after this issue.

With global food prices higher than ever before, Merlyn's tortilla business is no longer generating sufficient income to meet her family's needs. But this determined mother remains adamant that she will not rob her children of their childhood by asking them to work. Instead, she is putting all her energy into building back up her tortilla business and continuing to work at the community garden.

While we will miss sharing her journey with you, at World Renew we respect the dignity and rights of each and every participant-including Merlyn's right to stop sharing her story. Merlyn will continue to benefit from opportunities that generous gifts like yours make possible through the Free A Family program and we thank you for continuing to keep Merlyn and her children in your prayers.



HOLDING ON TO HOPE

N SEPTEMBER 2021 after drought had ravaged farms and left 2 million Kenyans struggling with food insecurity, the president of Kenya, Uhuru Kenyatta, declared a national disaster. But even before the drought, restrictions put in place to slow the spread of COVID-19 had caused a surge in food prices and slowed markets-leaving vulnerable families unable to meet their basic needs.

For Kadzo Kenga, the pandemic and the ongoing drought have severely impacted her earning potential. The soil is dry and her crops don't grow. Even if she could afford to put in an irrigation system to bring water to the hardened earth, there are few people in the markets buying anything. Although she has shut down the green grocery kiosk where she sold her vegetables, she has not given up.



Kadzo's greatest desire is to ensure her children have a better life than she has had. Looking back on her own childhood, she sees that her parents' strictness was harmful. They did not allow her to go out and make friends; now, with only the company of her family, she often finds herself feeling isolated. So Kadzo encourages her two younger children, Ivana and Patrick, to visit with friends. She tells them the more people they know, the

more opportunities they have to learn. She shared, "I have learned new things from my children. For example...[they] taught me not to overcook the vegetables since they learned from their friends that overcooking vegetables kills all valuable nutrients."

It is Kadzo's willingness to learn that World Renew Kenya field staff admire most about her. So it is not surprising that even in the face of drought she continues to seek out ways to irrigate her land-working long hours to run pipes to a nearby river. One staff member explained, "...because [she] puts [her] trust in God, Kadzo has now developed a self-reliant spirit and hence she works hard...to provide for her family. She is now hopeful and faces life positively."

THE GLOBAL FOOD EMERGENCY

In Honduras, COVID-19 restrictions caused a decline in Merlyn's tortillas sales, drastically reducing her income. In Kenya, drought wiped out Kadzo's crops and her ability to provide for her family. And as the conflict in Ukraine continues to disrupt the supply of commodities like wheat and oil, more families are facing hunger. COVID-19, changing weather patterns, and conflict have created a global food emergency. Please help us to respond.
